
CHET A. BREWSTER

DIRECTOR/PRODUCER

Inspired by the dramatic appeal of television and filmmaking, Chet Brewster (a Boston native and current resident of Atlanta) represents a natural style, organization, and a creative vision. To enhance his talents, he attended one of the most renowned mass communication schools in the country, Emerson College. Seven days after graduation in May of 1986, CNN heard of his incredible skills and potential, recruiting him to become a part of their international team. Thus began Chet's journey...

One of his most precious jewels as a producer and director was the 1998-2001 Crown Royal "Kings of Comedy" tours. These record-breaking concerts never before produced in front of arena size crowds, brought nationwide laughs to millions who were entertained by the royal comedic styles of D.L. Hughley, Cedric "The Entertainer", Bernie Mac, and Steve Harvey. The success of this collaboration inspired the big screen adaptation called the "Original Kings of Comedy" movie where Chet was the technical production supervisor along side director Spike Lee.

Chet's other credits as a director, producer or technical director includes a Saturday morning magazine show call "TBS Storyline", the 2005 Red Carpet Pre-Show & Trumpet Awards for TV One, "Hopeville" starring Yolanda Adams, Donnie McClurken, and Kirk Franklin, 2003 Source Awards, "Laffapalooza" starring Jamie Foxx. The Queens of Comedy starring Mo'Nique from the UPN television series "The Parkers", both series aired on Showtime. Latham Entertainment Presents, a standup comedy tour and reality television show entitled The Kings and Queens of Comedy Search, a makeover reality show for TV One called Makeover Manor, as well as a television special for Evander Holyfield introducing recording artists on his Real Deal Record label, just to name a few.

Chet has also directed home video recordings for stage actor, director, writer, and now filmmaker Tyler Perry of the famed Madea stage plays and video series. Chet directed the video for all five of his plays released on VHS and DVD and was the first director to shoot a theatrical play, Tyler Perry's "Madea's Class Reunion", with a multi camera High Definition Video, thus creating one of the most pristine theatrical plays ever recorded on DVD. There are talks for Chet to direct his next DVD, "Madea Goes to Jail" in the fall of 2005 at the Fabulous Fox Theater in Atlanta.

As a multi camera director, Chet has also directed, technical directed and/or produced shows for various musical artists for live arenas, theaters, clubs, DVDs and television, such as Mint Condition, Anthony Hamilton, Angie Stone, STYX, Michael Bolton, Usher, Gerald Levert, Earth, Wind & Fire, The Isley Brothers, Toni Braxton, Maze featuring Frankie Beverly, Beatlemania, Shawn Mullins, James Brown, Jefferson Starship, The Doobie Brothers, Kool and The Gang and countless others.

Chet's success is an unquestionable example of his special artistic talent and dedication to his craft. This further proves he is visually and technically adept; detail orientated, and prepared to attack the demands of this ever-changing industry as a producer and director.
